from the Turks through the decisive sea battle of Lepanto. Apparently, he had prayed for her intercession prior to the battle taking place. Ever since then, the rosary has been regarded as a powerful prayer in part because we seek the intercession of Mary, and Jesus does not refuse Mary's requests. This is why I highly recommend that we use the rosary in our family prayer. As I am sure you all realize, the family in many ways is under attack from our secularized culture. There is certainly no shortage of articles or books out there that make mention of this. Whether you want to blame it on technology or decaying morals, the fact of the matter is still the same: It is increasingly harder and harder to keep families strong and intact these days. Many parents face concerns about how many negative things their children are so easily exposed to these days, and they wonder, "How can I instill values in my children and impress upon them a desire to follow the faith as they grow older?" Pope St. John Paul II once said that "We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the rosary." Why? Because family prayer is an indispensable form of communion within a family, and the rosary in particular is a powerful form of prayer that invites the Holy Family into the life of the family. Pope St. John Paul II also stated in Familiaris Consortio, "Only by praying together with their children can a father and mother exercising their royal priesthood – penetrate the innermost depths of their children's hearts and leave an impression that future events in their lives will not be

"TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE"

It was 47 years ago that three members of a Chicago Council Number 4698, CC Boyle Council, in Tinley Park wanted to do something to support people with mental retardation. They came to this decision because one of the member's daughter who was mentally retarded and recognized that this category of people needed financial assistance.

At first, they planned on distributing Forget me Not seeds. After reconsideration they decide that not everyone wanted seeds, so they decided to distribute Tootsie Rolls. They picked a day and the men from their council stood in front of store fronts for two days. They raised over \$30,000 in those two days.

The council then submitted the program at the Illinois State convention to adopt the program . It passed unanimously. The Illinois councils increased this \$30,000 to almost two million dollars. When this success had been published in the K of C magazine other 43 states soon adopted the program.

Traditionally, the Michigan councils hold this drive on Columbus Day weekend. In the past few years Michigan councils added the Palm Sunday weekend. Due to COVID this has been curtailed. However, this year under the direction of our mr Drive Chairman, Larry Redman, we were able to conduct two successful drives. The first was in front of the Kroger stores in Canton on Ford Road and also on Michigan avenue in September. Our brother knights on that day collected \$2,240.77. The second drive was held after all the masses, on Columbus Day weekend at St John Neumann. Thru the efforts of our brother knights we collected \$2,020.00.

On Oct 29 the Renaud Council will sponsor a "TRUNK or TREAT" at the council hall from 5:30 to 8:00 pm. There will be a


bonfire, Hot Cider, S'mores station, Carmel Apples and the lounge will be open.
