and Cathy Redman, Joe and Roz Bradley, Dennis Oszust, Joe Camill, Chuck Lang and Robert Liebau.







"THE WALK OF FAME".

In 1984, the Great Lakes Region of Caravans of the Order of Alhambra jointly purchased a camp in the Irish Hills of Michigan, now known as St. Francis Camp on the Lake.

St. Francis Camp on the Lake is a 501-(c)3, non-profit organization committed to providing the ultimate camp experience to children and adults with developmental disabilities. St. Francis Camp on the Lake is the premier camping facility for those with special needs. Our 36-acre site includes 195 feet of waterfront located on the shores of Goose Lake, sandy beach, rustic woods, developed nature trails, sports area, adventure course and two beautiful cedar lodges where campers and counselors are housed.

In 2012, with the help of the Knights, the camp built a brand new 35 bed log cabin style dormitory now called



"KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS HALL". The camp is now launching a new campaign to help support the ongoing expenses of this building. The current KNIGHT OF THE YEAR and FAMILY OF THE YEAR awards program pays tribute by presenting the recipient a plaque with that recognition. It is thought to expand and replace this program by offering a BRICK OF HONOR to be installed at St. Francis Camp on the Lake, displaying this achievement for perpetuity. This effort is twofold, one it still recognizes the achievement and two by purchasing the BRICK OF HONOR will create a badly needed funding source to support the camp and our campers by providing them with the ultimate camping experience they so richly deserve. A special place has been set aside for this ongoing campaign. It will extend along the walkway to KNIGHTS HALL and will now be known as "THE WALK OF FAME".

By vote of our members, starting this year our council purchase these Bricks of honor to recognize our Knight and family of the year.

Knights March for Life A reprint from Knightline

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, participating in the March for Life for the first time as leader of the Knights, expressed his support for the tens of thousands of people who took part in the annual demonstration. The march occurred as the Supreme Court weighs Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, the most significant challenge in many years to Roe v. Wade, the landmark case that legalized abortion in all 50 states in 1973.



Knights of Columbus from across the United States joined other pro-life advocates Jan. 21 in Washington, D.C., to defend the rights of unborn children at a historic March for Life. Only a few days before, the Order placed its 1,500th

ultrasound machine in a pregnancy resource center, a major milestone for the Ultrasound Initiative, which has helped countless women choose life since the program began in 2009.

A new Marist Poll, commissioned by the Knights of Columbus, shows that 71% of Americans support legal limits on abortion and 81% believe our laws should protect both the mother and her

Dear Brother,

Best wishes for a Happy and Healthy New Year!

As the daylight increases through January I set my sight on the new year and what I would like to accomplish. Setting goals seems like a better idea than making the traditional New Year's resolutions. Those resolutions seem to go by the wayside pretty quickly; maybe because they always seem the same year after year.

One goal I have set for this year is to check in with every single member. Many of you filled out the Annual Survey you received at the end of last year. Thanks to those that did! It allows me to update contact information and provide service for specific needs. If you did not yet complete it, I encourage you to complete and return it. It can be done online or by return mail.



Another focus I have for goals this year is to follow the tips for everyday holiness from St. Teresa of Calcutta. I recently printed them out and posted them on my refrigerator so I see them each day. Here they are:

1. Speak as little about yourself as possible.

Tip: Ask others about their day, and take time to listen!

- 2. Keep busy with your own affairs and not those of others.
- 3. Avoid curiosity.

Tip: She's talking about being nosey—the bad kind of curiosity!

- 4. Accept small irritations with good humor.
- 5. Do not dwell on the faults of others.

Remember: When you do this, you forget the GOOD in people and that they're a child of God, too!

6. Accept censures even if unmerited.

Tip: By this, she means taking DISAPPROVAL in a humble way.

7. Be courteous and delicate even when provoked by someone.

Tip: Know when to walk away or "stop responding." This can be hard and require extra prayers.

8. Choose always the more difficult task.
