## Pray for Life Adoration on Fridays

While Roe v. Wade was struck down by the Supreme Court earlier this year, the fight is not over. Michigan has a decades-old law that makes abortion a felony. The law has not taken effect as a Michigan judge has issued an injunction blocking the state law from being enforced. Additionally, there will likely be a proposal on the Michigan Ballot in November - Reproductive Freedom for All - that would amend the state Constitution to make reproductive freedom a right in our state. One of the actions we as Catholics can take to get this proposal

defeated (other than voting in November) is to pray. Fr. Paul has asked our council to help pray that this proposal does not pass as part of the Eucharist Adoration planned for October and November. Fr. Paul mentioned that he would appreciate having people at Adoration from noon to 6:00PM.

Help is also needed on Sunday, September 18, after the 12:30 Mass, to help run the event. This includes signups, scoring, chasing balls etc.


