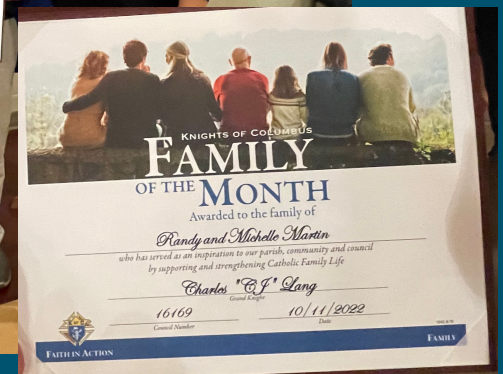
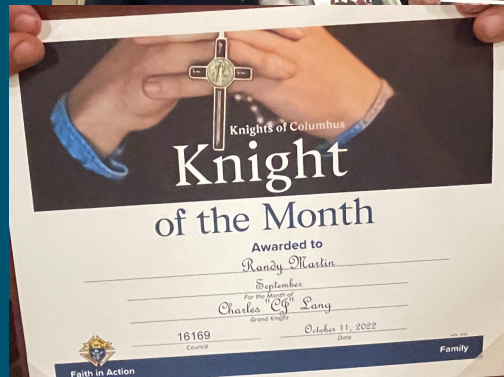

Sweatshirts for Holy Cross Services



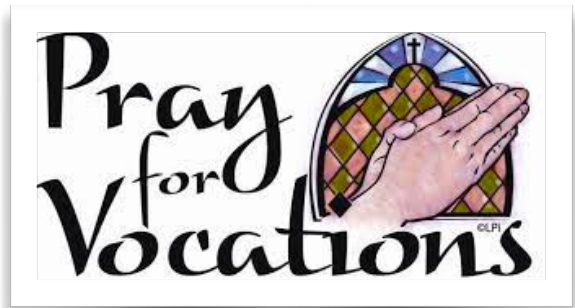
We are again collecting Christmas Gifts for Holy Cross Services.

Items available include:

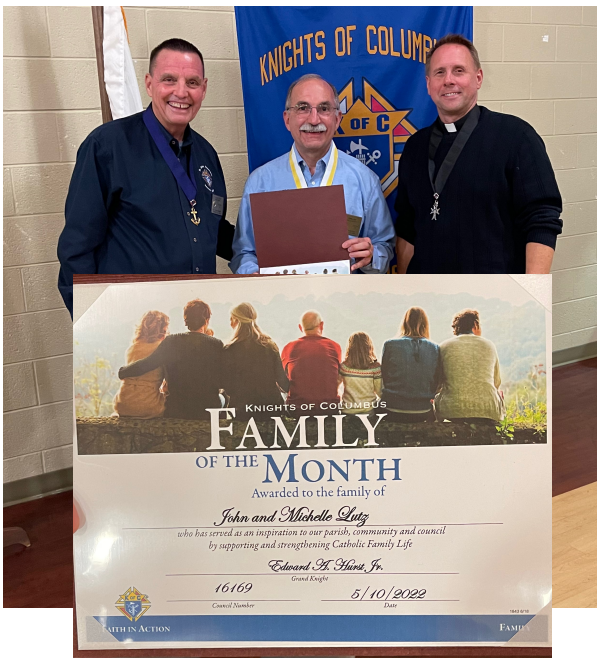
- Golf/polo shirt - \$20. (The polo shirts are 100% polyester and run a little big.)

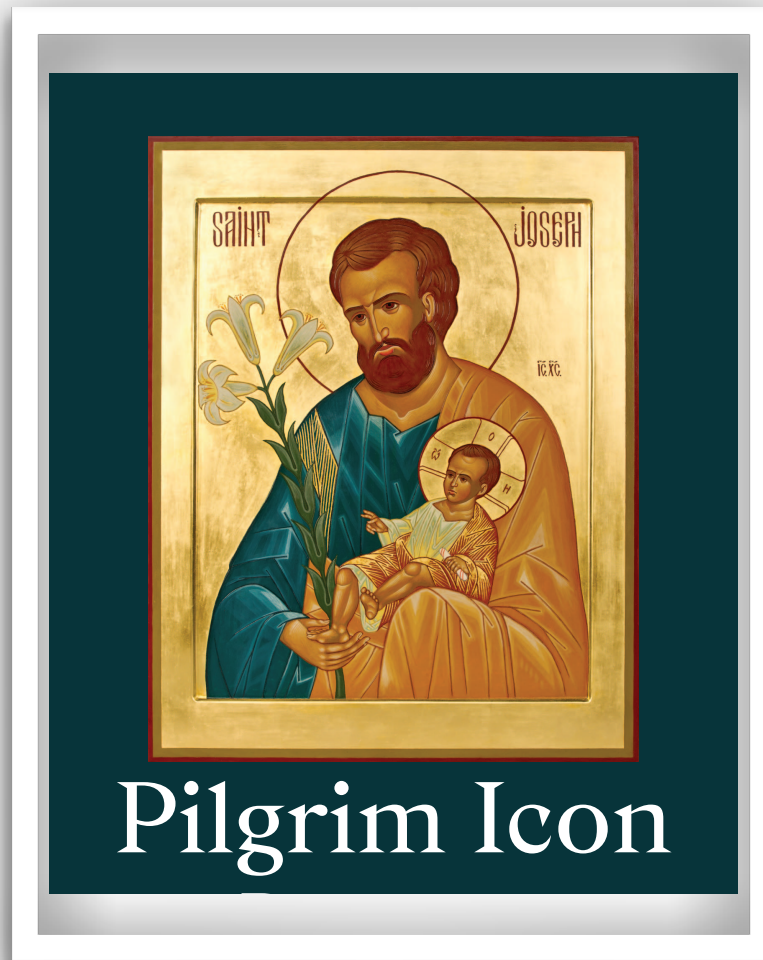
Understand the Icon

This beautiful icon is housed at St. Joseph's Oratory in Montréal, Canada's preeminent Shrine to St. Joseph, founded by St. André Bessette. The original is written (prayerfully painted) by Elizabeth Bergeron, from a drawing by famed

iconographer Alexandre Sobolev.

In the image, St. Joseph stands with his eyes cast humbly down, but with a determined strength in his face. In his covered arm he bears the Child Jesus, whose own hand is raised, blessing the world. In his right arm, St. Joseph holds a flowering staff, a sign that he was chosen by God. The white lilies of the staff signify his purity and chastity. Taken together, the icon provides a window into the life and mission of this courageous father, a man who was one of us and yet called to a mission of

incomparable significance. Our world desperately needs men and women of courage. But in a particular way, it needs courageous fathers — men willing to stand up and to carry out their own mission of protecting, defending and raising future generations. It needs men willing to risk it all, in order to offer the world Jesus. In short, our world needs men in the model of St. Joseph.

Promoting Catholic Education thru New Smart



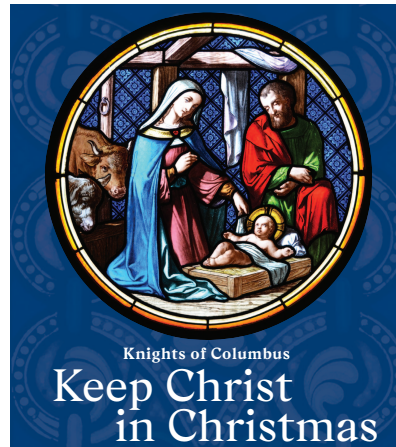
Throughout the year our council donates funds for many different things and projects of the church and other organizations.

Keep Christ in CHRISTmas



Again this year, our council will sponsor the "Keep Christ in CHRISTmas" poster contest. The contest is open to all youth between the ages of 5 and 14.

The Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest can consist of up to five

levels of competition: council, district, regional, jurisdictional and international.

The poster must reflect the theme of Keep Christ in Christmas. Each poster should be the original work (including concept, layout, slogan and any visual images) of a single person. Poster should be approximately 11x17 inches. However, the Supreme Council will not disqualify based on poster size. If pastels, chalk or charcoal are used, the poster must be laminated or covered with clear plastic.

A 100-point scoring system will be used to determine the winners. Slogan — 30 Points: How clearly is the theme presented? Visuals — 30 Points: How well do the visuals convey the message? Overall Impact — 40 points: How effective was the poster in capturing your attention and causing you to reflect on the topic at hand?

The contest will be introduced to the students at St. John Neumann on November 12 and to the students at All Saints on Nov 16. Judging will be held on December 6.
