The Plymouth Canton Stars are one of 17 local groups that make up Area 23 of the Special Olympics of Michigan. They are a group of about 160 athletes that participate in 12 different sports throughout the year. Another donation from the collections is for \$940. This was allocated to St Francis Camp on the lake.

St. Francis Camp on the Lake is a 501-(c)3, nonprofit organization committed to providing the ultimate camp experience to children and adults with developmental disabilities. St. Francis Camp on the Lake is the premier camping facility for those with special needs. Our 36-acre site includes 195 feet of waterfront located on the shores of Goose Lake, sandy beach, rustic woods, developed nature trails, sports area, adventure course and two beautiful cedar lodges where campers and counselors are housed.

The third allocation is for the same amount \$940 to the St Luke Center.



Again this year our council has donated \$500 to sponsor the "Elizabeth Foundation". This donation and the donations from three other southeast Michigan council and one Assembly will be used to purchase and distribute food gifts to the needy of the Bacolod region of the Philippines.


This project was started by the Fr Victor Renaud council of Plymouth in 1997. The news of this program quickly spread to other southeast Michigan councils and for the past 26 years food packages have been freely given to the poor of the Philippines as a Christmas gift from these four councils. This year the SJN Mens breakfast club also made a generous donation.

Each Christmas gift package which is estimated to cost about \$2,50 will contain Rice , fish and noodles. Te distribution of these gifts is schedule during the week before Christmas at six different Catholic Churches, retreat centers and on the campus of the Missionaries of Charity which is the order of sisters that was founded in 1950 by St. Theresa of Calcutta.

Because off the growth of the program. The project had to form a 501(c)3 organization now known as the ELIZABETH FOUNDATION . With the donations from not only the Knights but by donations from individuals from six different Staes and Canada , the foundation is able to assist the poor in the Philippines with a weekly mobile soup kitchen and to assist the needy with medical, housing and educational needs.



It seems we say it every year: "It's Christmas; where did the year go?" Seems like a good time to look

back on the year and note all the gifts given by you and our members worldwide. As Supreme Knight

Patrick Kelly mentioned in his annual report this year in Nashville, Tennessee, we have much to be

thankful for and much more work ahead of us.
