Council Donates to Statues



Archbishop Allen Vigneron has commissioned the Cathedral to become an Apostolic Center. The goal is to permanently install all twelve apostles statues and their first class relics in the cathedral. This will allow pilgrims to experience self guided retreats when visiting the cathedral.
