

Proposed ByLaws Amendment Passes First vote

The Supreme council has decided to increase the per capita amount that is levied against each council. Also our council officers have proposed to subsidize the cost of name badges for all members. To off set these two increase in expenses , the following amendment to our bylaws is proposed. This prosaic will allow for an increase in the dues for regular members of our councils. The increase will be only a \$5 increase per year. approved by vote of the membership. The proposal was voted on at the last general membership meeting. Passage of the amendment requires another vote at the next meeting. To vote or to express your concern please attend the next meeting. The proposed amendment reads as follows:

"Article 1, Section 3. Each member shall pay annual dues. The annual dues of members shale \$45.00, except honorary members who shall pay the sum of State and Supreme Council per capita changes and levies, and honorary life members who shall pay nothing. A reduced rate of dues for insured members under 26 years of age may be established, but it shall not be less than \$3.00 per year. Except as stated above, the dues of associate and insurance member shall be the same."


We served more than 226 parishioners and collected donations of \$682.24, which will assist in funding our Right to Life charities.

On October 12, 2023, Brother Knights Jeff Battistella, Roger Biernat, Clint Randall (with his Mom Penny Randall), Joe Camill (with His wife Stephanie), and Marshall Grazioli (with his wife Colleen) together with Marshall's friends Jodi Ring and Mary Beth Hausman attended the annual AAA Pregnancy Resource Center's Fall Banquet Fundraiser at the Burton Manor in Livonia.

The AAAPRC was incorporated in 1973 as Birthright of Western Wayne County, changed to AAAPRC in 1982. 2023 represents the 50th year of operation for the center. Peggy Roberts, the current Director, gave the opening remarks in which she shared how at least 2700 babies have been saved from abortion over the life of the center and how her self described "Pro Neutral" mentality was changed to Pro Life at some point and how she then became the Director. in 2012 the State Council of the Knights of Columbus provided the center with an ultrasound machine, no doubt responsible for at lease some of these "saves".

Dr. Ben Carson was the main speaker which attracted a record 1700 attendees to the banquet. He shared his story about growing up without a father, about how life has to be protected from womb to tomb and how when he was named the 17th Secretary of the US Department of Housing and Urban Development he was advised to "drop the God stuff" advice of which, of course, he did not heed.





Our Council sponsored the table for a \$300 donation and \$180 in cash donations were collected at the October General Meeting. Christmas in the Philippines

It was 1994 and a few knights were socializing after a general membership meeting. I having just returned from a trip to the Philippines. I was describing the poverty that I had seen there. I saw people living in cardboard boxes, looking for the next meal and people turned away from the hospitals because they could not pay for the needed services.

These knights knew that they could not solve this problem but these five knights each decided to donate \$25 each so that when we returned to the Philippines the next year we would purchase food for some of these needy people. That was the beginning.

Soon other councils heard about this project that these knights started and wanted to join in. Every year since many different councils in the southeast Michigan area have donate and sent funds to continue the program that has become known as " Christmas in the Philippines". Last year, four councils (St John Neumann, Msgr Kerns council, St.. Edith Council and the Duns Scotus council) along with donations form the Bishop Gallagher fourth degree assembly, The St John Neumann Mens Prayer Breakfast group and several individuals were able to provide food packets to over 2,000 needy families in the Bacolod Philippines area.

Each food pack that contained rice, noodles and canned fish cost about \$2.20. All labor to package and distribute the food gifts was completed with volunteer help. Every penny that was donated went 100% to the hands of those needy people.

To conduct this program we have established a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. This organization, Elizabeth Foundation, allows all donations to qualify for a tax deductible status.




