I want to thank my brother Knights in District 114, for their donation of diapers and baby wipes for the Heart of Christ Clinic. The clinic is for women and children and is located at the former convent at the Basilica of St. Anne in southwest Detroit. and will address physical and spiritual needs. One of the partners is the Michigan Knights of Columbus. There is a chapel on site, where the plan is to have Knights lead a rosary several times a month. Mass will be offered. The clinic will have a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, medical assistants, and office assistants. They will offer services from pre-natal through death. The medical director OB-GYN is a Knight from the Daniel Lord Council #3959, in Livonia. With your contributions the district was able to donate 2,922 diapers and 9,896 baby wipes, due in large part to a \$400 donation from the Renaud Council#3292 in Plymouth. Thank you for all your support.

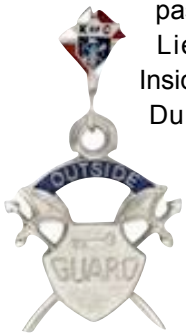

Why does KofC Sell Insurance ?

As we all know, the supreme council sells insurance. The question frequently arises, “ Why does the Knights sell insurance?”

The response to this question according to our KofC web site is as follows.

In that spirit, Father McGivney set off with “entrepreneurial zeal” to establish the Knights of Columbus. In his own words, Father McGivney wanted the organization to “unite the men of our Faith throughout the Diocese of Hartford, that we may thereby gain strength to aid each other in time of sickness; to provide for decent burial, and to render pecuniary assistance to the families of the deceased members.”

The initial system of “life insurance” designed by Father McGivney was a simple one, a pass-the-hat system through which each member could help support his brother Knights.

As membership grew so too did the insurance program. The Knights of Columbus has passed many milestones and received many accolades along the way: \$113 billion of life insurance in force; over 40 years of superior ratings from A.M. Best; and 18 consecutive years of sales growth, but all that is secondary.



None of our seminarians should be forced to leave the seminary because they don't have enough money to complete their studies. Our council is asking the parishioners of St. John Neumann to continue to donate cans and bottles to the Knights of Columbus, with the proceeds going to help seminarians of our Archdiocese. The knights will have control again of the bottle collection starting January.

For this to be successful, we need your help! Volunteers are needed to pick up cans and bottles from the church and return them to get the deposit back.

Brother Steve Otting is leading this effort. Volunteers are being asked to collect a few times on Monday through Thursday or they can volunteer to collect on Friday through Sunday. (Note that the first and the last time slots may have an additional day or two or may be shortened by a day or two depending on when the months start and end.)

119 – The Lord's Prayer

The Lord's Prayer is “the summary of the whole gospel,” Tertullian said. And we dare to pray it regularly. The Catechism teaches us that “The Lord's Prayer brings us into communion with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. At the same time it reveals us to ourselves. Praying to our Father should develop in us the will to become like him and foster in us a humble and trusting heart” (2799-2800). Essential to our Christian formation is the important fact: the Lord's Prayer reveals us to ourselves. Indeed, Christ reveals us to ourselves.

Your Volunteer hours are worth MONEY

Most of us put in many hours of volunteer work throughout the year. Some of this is with Knights of Columbus sponsored functions like the Coats for Kids program, the soccer ball tournament and the MI Drive for the Mentally Handicapped. Some of us volunteer in Church in roles as Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers, leading the rosary or other such events. Some of us just do volunteer work in our everyday lives, such as visiting the elderly or sick, shoveling the neighbors snow, or driving a person to the doctor or to get groceries.

We may do these things and not even think of them as volunteering. Then comes the end of the year and David Trost, our council's program director, will ask you to tally these hours. If you are like most, you don't remember all these little things that we did months ago. David has developed a spreadsheet that he recommends we can use year around to keep track of these hours of volunteering.

Why is this important? The supreme council sells insurance as was explained in a separate article. As a results of this a profit is made. This profit then allows our organization to perform many charitable programs each year. This profit is taxed by the government. However, your volunteer hours can be deducted from the profit by being priced at a minimum hourly rate.

Therefore, at the end of the year when the council asks for your volunteer hours, please be generous and report every hour that you gave, even if the hours were not performed as part of a KofC function.

Christmas in The Philippines Update

For the past 29 years, many of the southeast councils of the Knights of Columbus have supported a program that has come to be known as the "Christmas in the Philippines".



With funds donated by these councils and assemblies, along with donations from private individuals, food goods are purchased and repackaged and, with the assistance of the Catholic Church and the local Philippine Knights councils, I and the members of the Knights and the Church, enter in the poorer communities of the area and invite them to receive a Christmas gift of fish, noodles and rice.

We have already purchased over 1.6 tons of rice and the fish and noodles. Even if the prices of food has risen dramatically in the past year we were able to negotiate fair prices. Again this year each pack should cost about \$2.20 (US).
