

# **Noella Hurst Recognized for Life Saving Efforts**

On Thursday, June 29th of this year, Noella, 18, had not planned on going to Gaylord, MI, but at the last minute, that decided she would travel with her Father, Ed, to the K of C weekend conference. Little did she know what she was about to take place. That evening, Dad was coughing, was restless and was having a difficult time breathing. She herself was having a difficult time sleeping because of her father's

situation. Early that next morning, Ed was getting worse. Ed asked her to walk him to the car and take him to emergency. That's when Noella realized she needed to take decisive action. She sensed she could not do what he was asking in a timely and safe manner. She was not familiar with the area or even how to get to the hospital. She responded, No Dad, I am calling EMS, you are too weak to move on your own. God Bless her decision. When EMS arrived, they realized he was having a serious heart attack. EMS attendants told her she did the right thing. Ed would have never made it to the hospital alive. As a result of the seriousness of the situation, Ed had to be transported from the Gaylord Hospital to the Traverse City Hospital where he underwent major open heart surgery with 4 bypasses.

While all this was happening, Noella, 18, remained somewhat composed and collected. She called her mother, Mary Alice, who was at home and explained the situation. While waiting for her mother and sister, Noella stayed with her dad at the Gaylord Hospital until they transferred him to Traverse City. She kept in communication with Mary Alice as they made their way up to the Traverse City Hospital. Upon arriving, Noella had completed her part in saving her Father's life. Obviously overwhelmed by it all, and with the comfort and caring of many Knights and their



spouses, she remained in Gaylord for a short time before traveling to Traverse City to join her family. Her actions saved her father's life.

Noella, In recognition for your life saving action, quick thinking and resolve under pressure, On behalf of the Knights of Columbus, I present this certificate of appreciation to you.

Due to the unexpected passing of Brother Robert Lebeau, the position of Inside guard is now vacant.



Again on behave of the Elizabeth Foundation, Thank you and may God bless you for your love and kindness.


# **Council's Free throw Contest Announced for January 21**

Since 1972, councils have sponsored the Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship for boys and girls from the ages of 9 to 14 to provide an athletic outlet and encourage the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Kids compete within their own gender and age and progress from local level to district, regional and state/province competitions.

Again this year, our council will sponsor the Free Throw contest on Jan 21. Last year Bryson Harper, a contestant representing our council advanced thru the district, Region, State and international levels to become the INTERNATIONAL CHAMPION.

The competition is open with out charge to ALL youths between the ages of 9 (nine) thru 14 (fourteen). The contestant does not have to be a member of the knights family, does not have to be Catholic nor live in Canton.

All competitors must register using the official Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship Entry Form/Score Sheet (#1598). This form is at the end of this newsletter and will be available at the time of the contest. Proof of age must accompany all entry forms. Preregistration is recommended, but it is not required. The entry form/score sheet and proof of age must accompany participants through all levels of competition. Each youngster may compete in only one council competition. Winners will progress to the district, regional and state levels of competition. International champions are chosen on the basis of state-level results.





#### Ages 9, 10, 11 (Boys & Girls Competitions)

Use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from a 12-foot foul line at a 10-foot-high basket. (NOTE: The normal foul line is 15 feet from the basket. Foul lines at 12 feet from the basket for 10- and 11-year-old divisions should be clearly marked with athletic or masking tape prior to the competition.)

#### Ages 12, 13, 14 (Girls Competitions)

Use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot- high basket.

#### A g e s 12, 13, 14 (Boys Competitions)

Use a men's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from a 10-foot-high basket.

Each contestant receives three warm-up tosses followed by 15 consecutive Free Throw attempts from the appropriate age-designated foul line (see the Court/Equipment/Age section for proper ball sizes and foul line distances). To break a tie, contestants take a second round of five free throws. No warm-up tosses are permitted for the tie-breaker rounds. Successive rounds of five free throws each continue until a winner emerges.

#### ATTENTION FELLOW BOTHERS!

Your help will be needed for the Basketball Championship. Brother Marshall Grazioli is chairing this event and will need help not only setting up for the event but also recruiting and contacting the schools and local parishes. Also there is a need for judges. Besides our council's contest, In February our parish will host the district and regional contests and help will be needed for these. If you are interested please contact Bro Marshall. There will be a sign up link on our web site soon.

# REFUND SUPPORT VOCATIONS PROGRAM (RSVP)

Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of the RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

Last year with the funds from the "Cans for Seminarians" program we were able to collect and give to the seminarians \$6000.

This year, we have again budgeted for 3 seminarians. However, last year two of our seminarians were ordained. Therefore, we are currently looking for two more seminarians.

# St. John Neumann January 5 Feast Day

People called him the stubby priest and laughed when they saw him riding his horse, because his feet did not touch the stirrups. He was not very good-looking – a square face, a square body. He was quiet, not a man with a vivacious personality, not one to charm a crowd or draw attention to himself. He was not the type of Church leader who pleased influential



people. But John Nepomucene Neumann was a man of God who was also true to himself and he did the best job he could do.

Born and educated in Bohemia, John was interested in botany and astronomy as well as Church matters. By the time he was twenty-five, he knew six languages and was a trained seminarian. Since there were many priests in his country, and since he longed to be a missionary in America, John came to the United States in 1836 – with one suit of clothes and one dollar in his pocket.

The bishop of New York ordained John and sent him to the hardworking German-speaking people who were clearing the forests around

Niagara Falls. He traveled on horseback from one mission station to another, visiting the sick, teaching catechism, and training teachers to take over when he left. He was busy with his many responsibilities, but very lonely at times. He felt the need for the fellowship of community life and for the spiritual challenge that living with other priests might bring.

So John entered the Redemptorist Order. As a novice, he was sent to different places so frequently that he wondered if his superiors really wanted him. Finally they allowed him to make his vows, and he became the first Redemptorist to be professed in the United States. He helped in parishes until he was made the superior of the American branch of the order. While John felt very unqualified in this position, it was due to his direction that the Redemptorists became leaders in the parochial school movement. He served as a parish priest in Baltimore until he was made bishop of Philadelphia in 1852. There was great opposition to his appointment at that time.

The influential, wealthy Catholics wanted someone who would make a good impression: one who would speak eloquently and act the part of a refined, polite gentleman.

# K of C Scholarship Applications are available after Jan 1

Did you know that the Knights of Columbus grants scholarships? Each has different qualifications and different deadlines for submission. Below are listed those that are available in the United States. There is also a scholarship for seminarians. An applicant must be:

- 1.Entering freshman year, of a four-year, undergraduate program, leading to a bachelor's degree, at a Catholic college or Catholic university, in the United States.
- 2. A member in good standing of the Knights of Columbus, a son or daughter of such a member, or of a such a deceased member, who at the time of death, was in good standing, or a Columbian Squire in good standing. (Not limited to fourth degree members)

#### U.S. UNDERGRADUATES

An eligible candidate for these scholarships is a K of C member in good standing, a child of the member or of deceased member who was in good standing. Scholarship candidates should be entering the freshman year in an approved Catholic college in the United States and its territories as a fulltime student in a bachelor's degree program.For more information or to apply follow this link:

Swift Educational Trust Scholarships are available to children of members in good standing who are killed or permanently disabled, by hostile action, while serving in the armed forces in a combat zone identified as eligible by the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors; as well as the children of fulltime firefighters and law enforcement officers, who while in the lawful performance of their duties, died as a result of criminal violence directed at them. In either event, applications must be filed within two years of the date of death or disability.
