A Message from Our District Deputy Dan Timmerman

Having returned from the State Convention on Mackinac Island there are a lot of things the council should be proud of. The council was recognized as a Double Star Council, one of only ten councils so recognized out of 406 active councils in the state. What an accomplishment! Congratulations. Father Paul, Father Jeff, Father Onye, DD Ed Hurst, Master of the Fourth Degree Gene Suchyta, GK Charles Lang, DGK Steve Sarlitto, and myself were all representing the council. What a showing.







A Report of the Michigan State Convention

The 124 th Knights of Columbus Michigan State Convention took place May 22 nd thru 24 th 2024 at the Grand

Hotel on Mackinaw Island. St. John Neuman and Council 16169 was very well represented at the convention. In attendance were Archdiocesan Chaplin Fr. Paul Ballien, Fr. Paul Onyebuchi, Fr. Jeff Day, Diocesan Membership Director Hans Hansen, District Deputy 114 Dan Timmerman, District Deputy Ed Hurst, 4 th Degree District Master Gene Suchyta, Council 16169 Grand Knight Chuck Lang and Deputy Grand Knight Steve Sarlitto. Bishops from across the state were in attendance including Detroit Archbishop Allen Vigneron who celebrated the convention opening Mass on Wednesday evening. It was a great gathering of Councils from around the state with many topics covered during the three days and the Grand Hotel acting as a beautiful setting for all of it. Here are just a couple of highlights of the many activities that took place at the convention.




Baseball Field named in honor of Blessed Fr. McGivney

This Month's Featured CIS Booklet



Since its founding, the Knights of Columbus has been involved in evangelization. In 1948, the Knights started Catholic Information Service (CIS) in response to blatant anti-Catholic bias in other religious media in order to educate non-Catholics about the beliefs and practices of the Catholic Church.
