Looking back on their lives, they realize how richly blessed they have been. Their biggest blessing, without a doubt, is their family. They have two married children and 5 amazing grandkids. Their daughter Stephanie has been married to Brad Naberhaus for over 25 years. Their son, Donnie has been married almost as long to Melissa Simons. They know they could not have asked for better matches for their children. Especially because the marriages have produced 5 amazing grandkids. Eva, soon to be 19, is a sophomore at the University of Michigan. Luke, 16, Eli, 16. Lana 13 and Gabe 13 are cousins who consider themselves good friends. Don and Lorraine know how fortunate they are to have their family living close by.

Lorraine is a retired pediatric speech pathologist. In 1988 she opened a private practice called Speech and Language Systems Inc. in Plymouth. It evolved into the Building Bridges Therapy Center when Brad and Stephanie returned from Chicago to take over the business almost 20 years ago. 
