

had several people drive by who yelled obscenities or gave us obscene gestures. On the other hand there were a lot of people that honked their car horns and gave us thumbs up. There is no doubt that this can push you out of your comfort zone, but it is a cause that is worth it. It felt good to do something to take a stand for Life and those babies who have no one to speak for them.

Pam and I then attended the AAA Pregnancy Resource Center annual Fall Banquet on October 10 th . See the article on this event within the newsletter. This was the annual fundraiser for the center. Nearly 800 people were in attendance. The guest speaker for the evening was TV and movie personality Kevin Sorbo. The event was not one where we stretched our comfort zone, but it was an opportunity to share dinner and social time with likeminded people in support of and organization that is doing so much to help pregnant women make the right choice to have their babies. AAA also provides three years of after pregnancy support for the new mothers.

The presentations from AAA Pregnancy CEO Peggy Roberts and Kevin were awesome. The Knights of Columbus were specifically recognized for our work in providing and material donations to the center and financial help through the Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program.

One more opportunity that we have is to make a statement is in our own front yards. We have had a "Choose Life" sign in our front yard for over two years. Ever since Proposal 3 was on the ballot in Michigan. I left that sign in our yard even after the 2022 election and it certainly has gotten a little rough around the edges.

I wanted to try to get that message to stick in people's minds and know that the people who live here are not just throwing our sign away after one defeat. We also have a school bus stop in front of our house. My hope is that every day this message, little by little, gets across to the high school kids on that bus. Especially the girls who have so much pressure coming from secular



society telling them it's their body and therefore their choice.

There will have newly printed "Choose Life " yard signs available to SJN Parishioners soon. I would encourage you to get one and place it in your lawn. You might not know the life you change just by having it there for people to see.

God Bless all of you as together we fight for Life, from conception to natural death.






Fraternal Hours

The actual categories are fixed by Supreme.

Save the File in a folder for your future use this year by "SAVE AS" and include Your Name in the File.

At the end of the year, I'll send out a reminder for you to either email me back the file to PD16169@mikofc.org, or Print the Tab and I'll collect it.

Christmas in the Philippines Elizabeth Foundation Every year our council supports

Every year our council supports the Elizabeth Foundation. This

foundation had its beginnings in 1994 as a project of the Fr. Victor J Renaud council of the Knights of Columbus. After becoming aware of the poverty in the Philippines, five of the brother knights each donated \$25 to feed the poor. That year with the assistance of the Philippine knights of Columbus, food packages were purchased and distributed to over 150 needy families of the Negros Philippine area.

After the great success of this project the Renaud council continued its support for many years to come. Several other Southeast Michigan councils heard



of this program and decided to join in. Thru the past 30 years this program continued and some councils continued and some councils dropped out of the program. For the past five

years, our St. John Neumann Council has budgeted \$500 to be used for the program which has become known as the "Christmas in the Philippines" program.

Over the years the program has obtained a non Profit status with the USA government as a tax deductible 501(c)3 non profit known as the "Elizabeth Foundation". This status allows every donation to the programs to be tax deductible by the donor on his or her Federal tax return.



During these past 30 years, the foundation has increased its programs to not only include the "Christmas in the Philippines" program which gives food packages and soup every Christmas, but also includes

programs such as the Adopt a Family "program. This program the sponsor for a \$50 per month donation provides needed food to the poor families on a Biweekly basis. Other programs has provided housing, educational and Medical needs.
