

I started attending Thursday MPB in 2016 while I was still working and before I became a Knight in 2020. I have attended the Saturday Cor MPB since we started those sessions last year. First, I must acknowledge the great job that Ron Kretschmer and Jim Kullman do in making the Thursday and Saturday sessions so successful. Ron is there bright and early to have light breakfast snacks and coffee setup. Jim selects the theme for each session which consists of a video. They are both great early morning greeters too!

Most guys usually show up 10-15 minutes early to get their coffee and share in some lighthearted banter. Usually sports is involved. The one-hour session kicks off promptly at 6:00am (every Thursday) or 8:30am (4 th Saturday) with an opening prayer, followed by a couple of minutes of "Prayer & Praise". This is where any one of us can ask for Prayers for a family member, friend, or even ourselves for some need that we might have, Also the opportunity to share a "Praise" for something that God has blessed us with over the past week. Once all Prayers or Praise have been asked for we recite together a short "Prayer for the Sick" followed by one decade of the rosary. We then move to the video which is approx. 20 minute long followed by discussion. Again, sharing thoughts on the video topic is not required. Several of the guys do which normally prompts further sharing. Hopefully everyone is learning and growing a little bit more by just being together. The session ends promptly in one hour with a closing prayer and then everyone is on their way to their day. We normally have 20-30 men attend on any given morning. Sometimes we are lucky enough to have either Fr. Paul, Fr. John or Fr. Jim join us. The environment is not intimidating at all. No one is put on the spot to contribute. I know that 6:00am on Thursday may sound impossible, whether you are working or not working, but it is only once a week and once you get into the swing of it you find the Holy Spirit will help you get up early to attend. I truly hope that this article moves you to give MPB a try, either on Thursday or the 4th Saturday. I know that attending has truly helped my faith grow stronger over the years. I suggest that you just give it a try just once and see what you think. I think you will enjoy it and will want to keep coming back. I look forward to seeing you at an upcoming meeting.

In closing I want to wish all of you and your families a Joyous, Blessed and Merry Christmas as we celebrate the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ to save us. I pray that 2025 will bring great blessings upon you, your loved ones and our Council. God Bless all of you. Thank you for all that you do as a Brother Knight for Council 16169. See you in the Eucharist!!





(Note that many Rows, Columns, and cells are protected to retain consistency from file to file)
- In the second tab title "Explanation", we included activities we typically conduct and placed them in categories which seemed reasonable. If you don't find a particular program you were involved with, then simply add the hours to an existing category and capture any comments in the Comments Column. The actual categories are fixed by Supreme.

Save the File in a folder for your future use this year by "SAVE AS" and include <u>Your Name</u> in the File.

At the end of the year, I'll send out a reminder for you to either email me back the file to PD16169@mikofc.org, or Print the Tab and I'll collect it.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain William E. Lori:



E a c h m o n t h , Archbishop William Lori -Supreme

Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus – selects a brief passage from the Gospel reading of one of the Sunday Masses of the month.

"Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." (Gospel for Dec. 1, Lk 21:36)

To remain watchful is a frequent exhortation of Jesus, for we do not know when the end will come. For most people, their end will come at the moment of their death. We trust in God's grace, but grace requires our response: We must not grow lax and presume we have plenty of time to repent. We must pursue holiness and seek God's will at all times so that we stand ready to meet him at any time.

This month, in which we celebrate the birth of Jesus, I challenge you to meditate on the poor shepherds who watched over their flocks on the night he was born and identify one way you can better incorporate watchfulness into your own life.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you maintain a practice of daily prayer, regular examination of conscience and frequent confession, or do you sometimes grow spiritually lazy? Do you commit yourself to steady growth in holiness and virtue as preparation for the final judgment? Do you teach and encourage your loved ones to do the same?
