

It is hard for me to describe in a short article what we experienced across the nine weeks. Let me just say that what we really learned and experienced was just what the title of the program is. That we a have been Rescued and that Rescued people Rescue others. It helps us continue our growth so that we can witness our faith to others and bring them closer to God. The Rescue Project is for anyone and everyone! It appeals to those who have been walking with Jesus for years, as well as those for whom Jesus is only a figure in ancient history. It helps makes better sense of the gospel, the fight that we are in with the evil one in this world and seeing that there is a life that is vastly different from the story our modern





Since its founding, the Knights of Columbus has been involved in evangelization. In 1948, the Knights started Catholic Information Service (CIS) in response to blatant anti-Catholic bias in other religious media in order to educate non-Catholics about the beliefs and practices of the Catholic Church.

130 - The Eighth Commandment

The Church teaches that human truth consists in the conformity of things to the human intellect, which is necessarily relativistic, if not subjectivistic, since there are "many truths in many created intellects" because of the ways things are known. What gets twisted is the meaning of "relativism." Avoiding a wrong notion of "relativism," the Church teaches there is a divine intellect and argues that although there are many truths, all truths are ultimately expressions of the one Truth which, is God. So, there is objective truth as there is truth relative to the individual but in the end, the relative is corrected by the objective.

K of C Scholarship Applications are available after Jan 1

Did you know that the Knights of Columbus grants scholarships? Each has different qualifications and different deadlines for submission. Below are listed those that are available in the United States. There is also a scholarship for seminarians. An applicant must be:

- 1.Entering freshman year, of a four-year, undergraduate program, leading to a bachelor's degree, at a Catholic college or Catholic university, in the United States.
- 2. A member in good standing of the Knights of Columbus, a son or daughter of such a member, or of a such a deceased member, who at the time of death, was in good standing, or a Columbian Squire in good standing. (Not limited to fourth degree members)

U.S. UNDERGRADUATES

An eligible candidate for these scholarships is a K of C member in good standing, a child of the member or of å member who was in good stan d i n g . Scholarship candidates should be entering the freshman year in an a pproved C atholic college in the United States and its territories as a full-time student in a b a c h e l o r 's degreeprogram. SEMINARIAN

Each year, the Knights of Columbus offers a limited number of \$2,500 scholarships for tuition, room and board to men studying for the Catholic priesthood at major seminaries. Any applicant with appropriate ecclesiastical approval, having been accepted at a major seminary, and studying for an (arch) diocese or religious institute in the United States, its territories, or Canada is eligible. Special consideration may be given to upperclassmen who are members of the Knights of Columbus, or whose fathers are members, and/or those with a background in the military. The maximum scholarship is \$2,500 per year, renewable each year of study at a "major" seminary to a total of four years, upon evidence of satisfactory performance, and subject to the discretion of the Department of Scholarships.








Men's Prayer Breakfast

People called him the stubby priest and laughed when they saw him riding his horse, because his feet did not touch the stirrups. He was not very good-looking - a square face, a square body. He was quiet, not a man with a vivacious personality, not one to charm a crowd or draw attention to himself. He was not the type of Church leader who pleased influential people. But John Nepomucene Neumann was a man of God who was also true to himself and he did the best job he could do. Born and educated in Bohemia, John was interested in botany and astronomy as well as Church matters. By the time he was twenty-five, he knew six languages and was a trained seminarian. Since there were many priests in his country, and since he longed to be a missionary in America, John came to the United States in 1836 - with one suit of clothes and one dollar in his pocket. The bishop of New York ordained John and sent him to the hardworking German-speaking people who were clearing the forests around Niagara Falls. He traveled on horseback from one mission station to another, visiting the sick, teaching catechism, and training teachers to take over when he left. He was busy with his many responsibilities, but very lonely at times. He felt the need for the fellowship of community life and for the spiritual challenge that living with other priests might bring. So John entered the Redemptorist Order. As a novice, he was sent to different places so frequently that he wondered if his superiors really wanted him. Finally they allowed him to make his vows, and he became the first Redemptorist to be professed in the United States. He helped in parishes until he was made the superior of the American branch of the order. While John felt very unqualified in this position, it was due to his direction that the Redemptorists became leaders in the parochial school movement. He served as a parish priest in Baltimore until he was made bishop of Philadelphia in 1852. There was great opposition to his appointment at that time. The influential, wealthy Catholics wanted someone who would make a good impression: one who would speak eloquently and act the part of a refined, polite gentleman.
